b) Must followers of Christ bury their dead relatives or is there freedom in this matter?

3. Review Sarah's life.

a) What qualities did she show in her character? (See Is. 51:1-2 & 1Pe. 3:3-6)

b) In what ways can we follow her example today?

4.a) What can we learn about business practice from Abraham's example?

b) What should we do if we get cheated? (See Ro. 12:17-21)

c) Why did Abraham make sure that others witnessed the transaction (vv.16-18)?

d) Why is it important that business deals are done in the open?

5.a) What is the city that God has prepared for His people? (See Heb. 11:16)

b) What should our attitude be to this world (v4)? (See also Heb. 11:13)
